This year five outstanding PHS alums will be inducted into the Honor Roll: Dan Hasenfratz '61, Jan McNeal Dickerson '67, Steve Kukuk '67, Craig Kemnitz '72, and Larry Beisel '79.

Hasenfratz, who passed away in 2021, was a lieutenant colonel in the Oklahoma National Guard and an EMS helicopter pilot for 17 years. Dickerson has volunteered with the American Therapeutic Riding Center and other groups. Kukuk, a career Air Force officer, advises the U.S. military around the world. Kemnitz owns the longest-running service station in Oklahoma and helps in many Perry causes. Beisel, who passed away in 2021, was a West Point graduate who served all over the world, including as a Foreign Area Officer and Defense Attache and negotiated defense treaties.
